

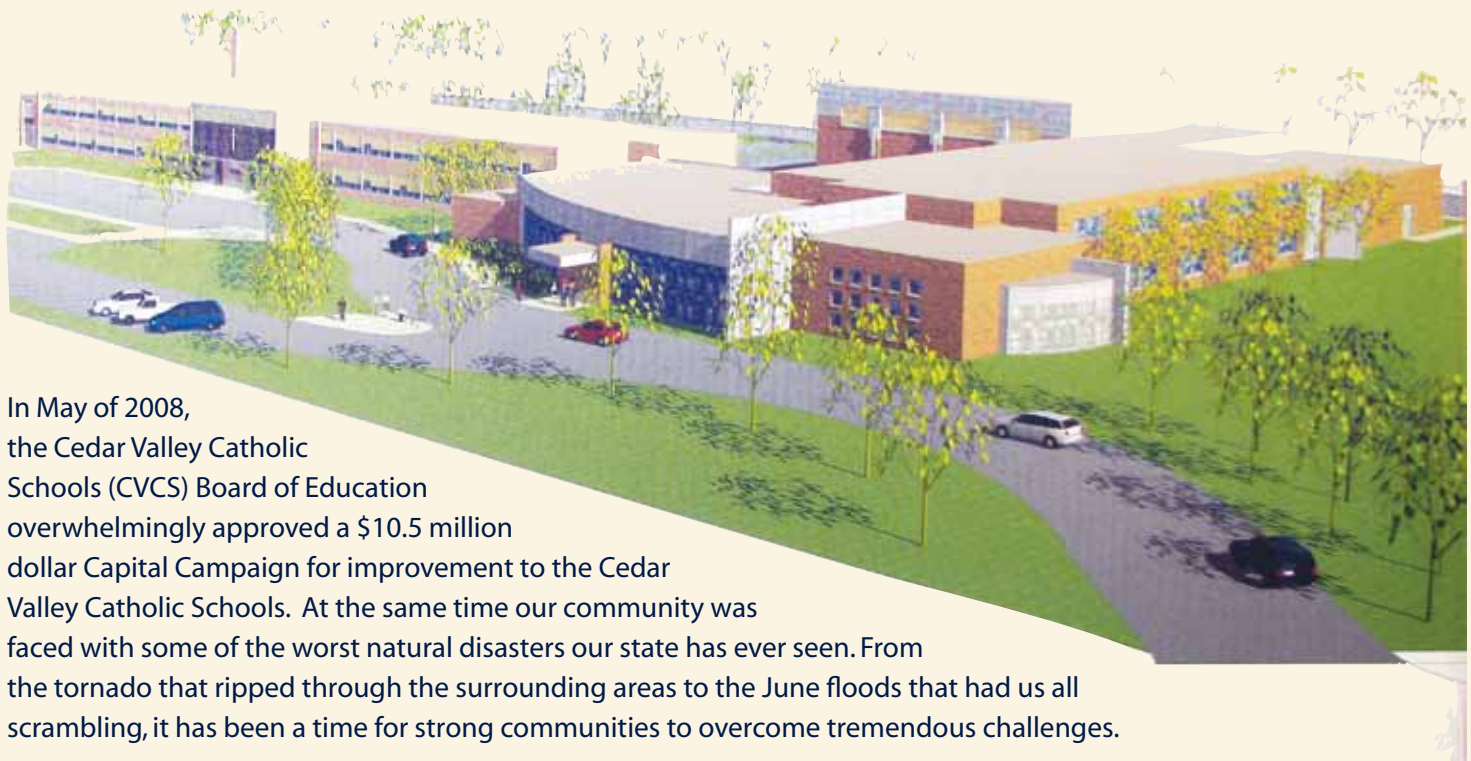

Season of challenges and communities coming together



In May of 2008, the Cedar Valley Catholic Schools (CVCS) Board of Education overwhelmingly approved a \$10.5 million dollar Capital Campaign for improvement to the Cedar Valley Catholic Schools. At the same time our community was faced with some of the worst natural disasters our state has ever seen. From the tornado that ripped through the surrounding areas to the June floods that had us all scrambling, it has been a time for strong communities to overcome tremendous challenges.

Many from our Catholic community were affected by these disasters. The Cedar Valley community came together in this time of need. You saw young and old lending a hand in the sand bagging efforts and helping with clean up when all was done. From small fund raising events to delivering home cooked meals to help those in need, the Cedar Valley Catholic community responded. The Cedar Valley Catholic families came together and were well represented.

In September of 2008, CVCS kicked off the Capital Campaign to raise \$10.5 million, no small task. The money raised will go to renovate much needed areas of the Columbus High School building and parking lot, build a new modern middle school for the 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students, fund additional educational programs for K-12, and create a million dollar endowment to ensure financial stability, cost containment, and student tuition assistance.

Many Strategic Plan recommendations have already been realized. Improvements already implemented are: the hiring of a Campus Minister at the Columbus Catholic High School campus, introducing our student athletes to Covey Leadership Training, purchasing laptops at each school site, providing joint activities among all CVCS students, creating a student ambassador program, ensuring regular meetings of all CVCS Specialist teachers, hiring a middle school band instructor, creating a position of Activities Director to work with 5-12 Band, 7-12 Vocal and 6-12 Athletics.

We are faced with changes and challenges daily. How do we approach them and how do we rise above to stretch ourselves? It is by our Faith and communities coming together that we get through them. Together we can continue to make a difference. Keeping our youth always in mind, a wise man Msgr. Paul Steimel, said this the other day, "Children need to be nourished and nurtured in the Lord Jesus. They have a right to know where they come from, what their life is for, how to live it right and the eternal destiny that awaits them."

We are all blessed. Together "We Can" continue to make a difference to all the youth that wish to continue in their faith life through our Cedar Valley Catholic Schools. Message ...

Science

The Cedar Valley Catholic Schools Science Curriculum Committee has finished the articulation and alignment of the K-12 Science program. A committee of talented CVCS science teachers met regularly for 18 months to review the current Science curriculum. They identified gaps in the curriculum, as well as duplications. A new textbook series for K-6 was adopted. The use of this textbook resource along with the current Foss materials allows for a balance of scientific reading and inquiry in the CVCS Science curriculum.

Museum School

The third grade classes of the Cedar Valley Catholic elementary schools (Blessed Sacrament, Sacred Heart, and St. Edward) have attended the Museum School sponsored by the Grout Museum District for several years. The students attend this innovative program for one week. During this week, students experience living history presentations by Mary Hanna, one of the first pioneer women to the area; Lillian Russell Lampson from the Victorian era, and Jesse Bess, who helped make positive changes in the early 1900's for the African American in the Cedar Valley. Students also practice the footwork involved in Native American dances, sing folk songs, learn about simple machines, discuss the rich history of immigration and migration in the area, and share their research about an artifact during Family Night. The highlight of the week is a guided, horse-drawn trolley ride that tours downtown Waterloo. This program encompasses the curricular areas of social studies, math, science, reading, writing, geography, art, and music. The students keep a journal of what they have learned throughout the week.



Spanish Curriculum

The Cedar Valley Catholic Schools Spanish Curriculum Committee has finished the alignment of the PK-8 Spanish program. Each student in the elementary school (K-8) receives Spanish instruction twice a week. Preschoolers receive instruction once a week. Currently, the Spanish Curriculum Committee is working on the readjustment of the high school curriculum due to increased knowledge of students entering Columbus. This readjustment will allow for more oral language practice and real world application of the Spanish language.

Community ...

Flag Parade

On Friday, September 7, 2007, students from the Cedar Valley Catholic Schools participated in the Healing Field Memorial Celebration sponsored by the Exchange Club of Waterloo. The students, from Blessed Sacrament, Sacred Heart, St. Edward and Columbus High School marched in the parade that led to the Veterans Memorial in downtown Waterloo. Over 1000 flags were placed to fly in symmetry in honor of the veterans who have given their lives. The purpose of this event was to aid our local community in the process of healing.

Middle School Service Day

All CVCS students from grades 6-8 have participated in a day of service for the last three years. In the spring of 2008 they branched out into the community to clean public parks and cemeteries, nursing homes and hospital grounds. This included George Wyth Park and the Cattle Congress grounds. A group of students removed sandbags from the San Souci neighborhood area. After completing their service activities the students gathered at Columbus Catholic High School for a picnic lunch. This project served to bring the students together in a joint effort to aid their community.

Football players at Country View

Every year for the past five years the Columbus High School football players have reached out to the community through the residents of Country View Care Facility. The players participated in the Country View Fall Carnival, played bingo and card games with the residents, purchased holiday gifts and welcomed several Country View fans to the Homecoming games. The relationship between the residents and our student-athletes has grown throughout the years.



Worship ...

ACRE/IFG

The Cedar Valley Catholic School System is committed to the Catholic Identity of our schools and to the continued faith formation of our students and employees. In January of 2008, Cedar Valley Catholic Schools 5th, 8th, 11th graders and certified staff took the Assessment of Catechesis Religious Education (ACRE) and Information for Growth (IFG) assessment tools. The ACRE was administered to students, and the IFG was taken by CVCS teachers and administrators. The purpose of administering these assessments was to provide another data source in regards to assessing the religious instruction and formation that CVCS is providing to its students and staff. Students taking the ACRE were asked questions that assessed their religious knowledge as well as their personal beliefs, attitudes, practices and perceptions. The IFG asked our staffs questions concerning knowledge of the six Dimensions of Adult Faith Formation and questions about their attitudes, opinions, practices and perceptions. School administrators received group and individual score reports for the ACRE and group composite data for the IFG. Each staff member also received a personalized score sheet for the IFG.

The results of this assessment data has helped to shape student faith formation and adult faith formation for the 2008/2009 school year. CVCS principals reviewed student data to look for strengths and weaknesses. CVCS teachers have also been digging into this data to examine how it aligns with current teaching in order to effectively strive for best practice. Assessment data is helping to shape more effective Theology instruction. The IFG results have also influenced faculty faith formation this year. Group data was analyzed and staff input was sought to help design faith formation in-services that would benefit our staffs. Parish priests and Columbus Campus Minister Mary Pedersen have designed and delivered faith formation in-services to our teachers that are a result of the information taken from the IFG.

The ACRE will be administered to our students again this year to continue to evaluate current practice. CVCS will continue to honor its commitment to the faith formation of our students and staffs as well as our commitment to the Catholic Identity of our school system.

Mass of Remembrance

On All Saints/Souls Day the Columbus Family gathered to remember and pray for their deceased alums, faculty/staff, Hall of Fame members and relatives. The names of all the deceased were presented in a slide show before Mass began. Relatives of those who passed away from 2005 to present carried a candle which was placed in a special display to burn throughout the liturgy.

Perpetual Adoration

November 30, 2007 was a special day for the Catholics in the Cedar Valley area. Archbishop Hanus and several area priests concelebrated a Mass that began the observance of Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration. Located in the chapel at Columbus Catholic High School in Waterloo, the Eucharist is displayed 24 hours a day. Students, staff, volunteers, and the community all take advantage of the opportunity to be with Jesus Christ in silence and prayer. Service ...

Hospice Help

During the 2007/2008 school year, students in Mrs. Sue Davis' Clothing 2 class completed two service projects that combined what the students were learning in class with service to the greater Cedar Valley community. Students sewed gowns for Cedar Valley Hospice. Each student purchased 3 yards of fabric to construct the gown and then the gowns were sewn during class. After the gowns were completed, the class took a field trip to Cedar Valley Hospice and presented the gowns. These gowns were greatly appreciated by Hospice and are being utilized by the residents. The Clothing 2 students also sewed catheter bags designed especially for Country View residents. This project included cooperation on many levels. The need was identified and relayed to Columbus by Carol Luce. Donations of sturdy fabric were requested and received from our local parishioners. The students then sewed sturdy catheter bags that were constructed so that they could be attached to resident wheel chairs. In both of these projects, Columbus students and the Cedar Valley community benefited from a commitment to service learning. Columbus students put into practice both content skills and the value of service towards others.

Catholic Worker House

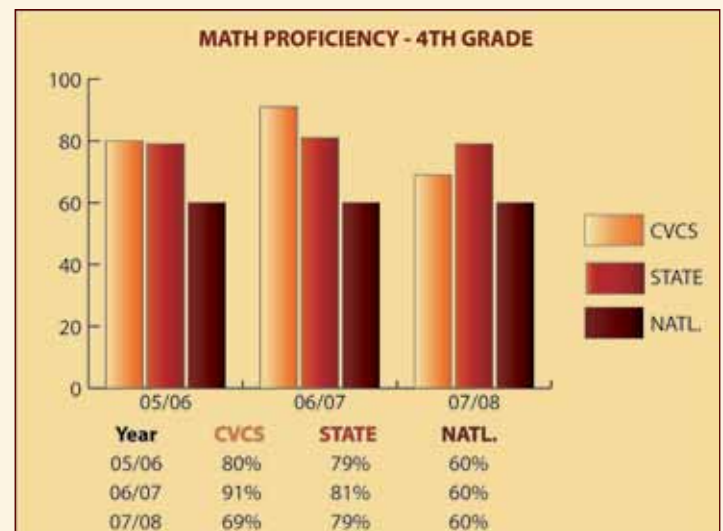
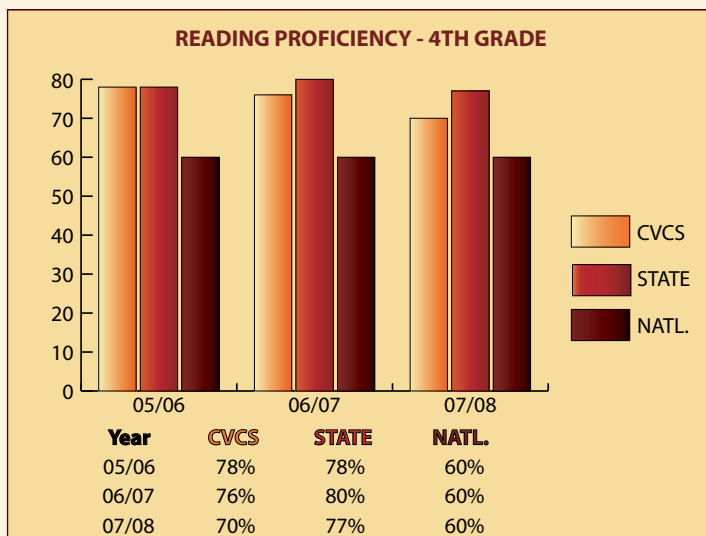


Under the leadership of Mr. Don Sullivan and with behind the scenes help from Linda Sullivan, students from St. Edward's School have been preparing weekly meals at the Catholic Worker House. Students help prepare and serve the food. When the meal is finished, they are responsible for the cleanup. Anywhere from twenty five to forty five people are served depending on the weather and the time of month. Meals vary from Mexican enchiladas to Chinese stir-fry. The main course is usually accompanied by a pot of hot soup. It is a very worthwhile experience for the young people. Not only do they gain valuable experience in the kitchen, but also they witness first hand those here in Waterloo who are less fortunate than themselves. Students come away feeling very good about the experience. "The biggest problem I have is limiting the number of students who go," says Mr. Sullivan. "Once they go, they want to go every week. It is, however, a good problem to have." St. Edward's students are scheduled to serve thirteen meals during the months of October, November, and December.

Annual Progress Report

Each fall, students in grades three through eight take the Iowa Test of Basic Skills (ITBS), and students in grades nine through eleven take the Iowa Tests of Educational Development (ITED). These tests are used to measure student achievement in reading, math and science. The scores are reported on student proficiency. Proficiency is defined as the percent of students scoring above the 40th percentile as measured by the ITBS and ITED. Following are the results of these tests at the 4th, 8th, and 11th grade levels.

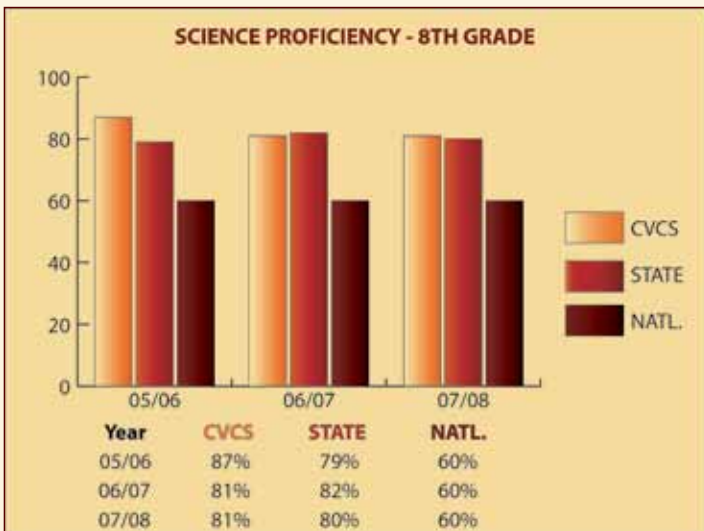
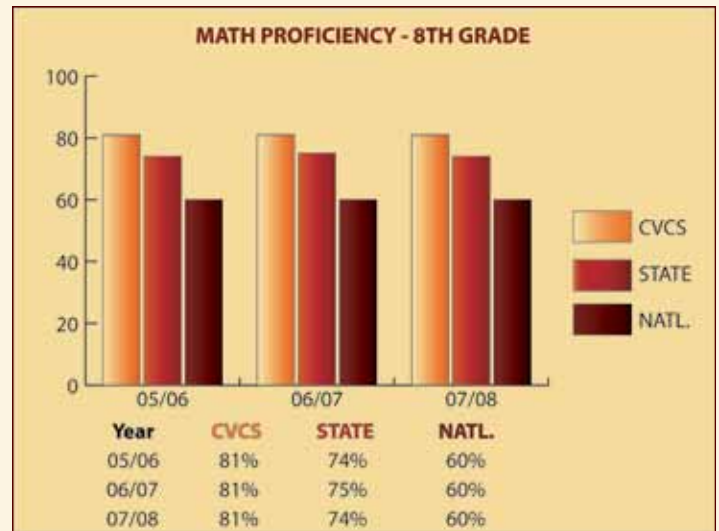
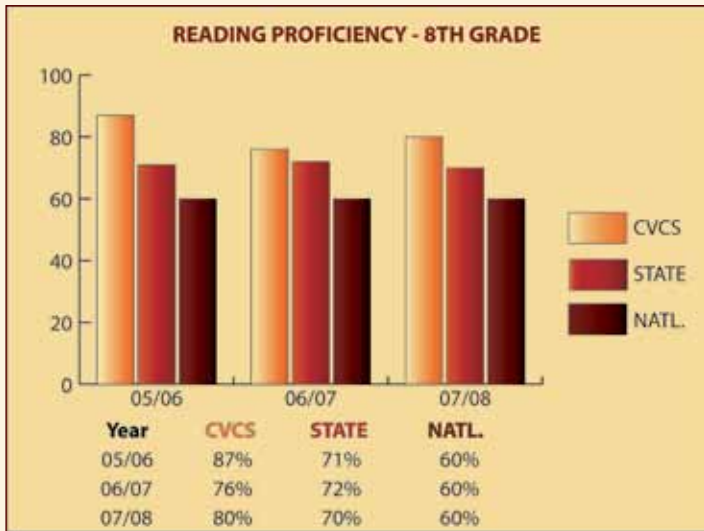

MATH GOALS

- Our goal was to increase the percentage of current fourth graders scoring at the proficient level on the ITBS as measured by the Math total score as fifth graders. The goal was not met. In 2006-2007, 91.2% of fourth graders were proficient. In 2007-2008, 90.9% of fifth graders were proficient. Our goal predicted we would see an increase in proficiency, however, there was a small 0.3% decrease.
- The action plan to meet this goal includes the following:
 - Continuation of rigorous professional development program that is focused on research-based instructional strategies and district goal areas.
 - Continuation of data study with teachers to gain a better understanding of need areas.
 - Test preparation, including test taking skills.
- During the 2008-2009 school year, CVCS will increase the percentage of 2007-2008 third graders scoring at the proficient level on the ITBS as measured by the Math total score as fourth graders.

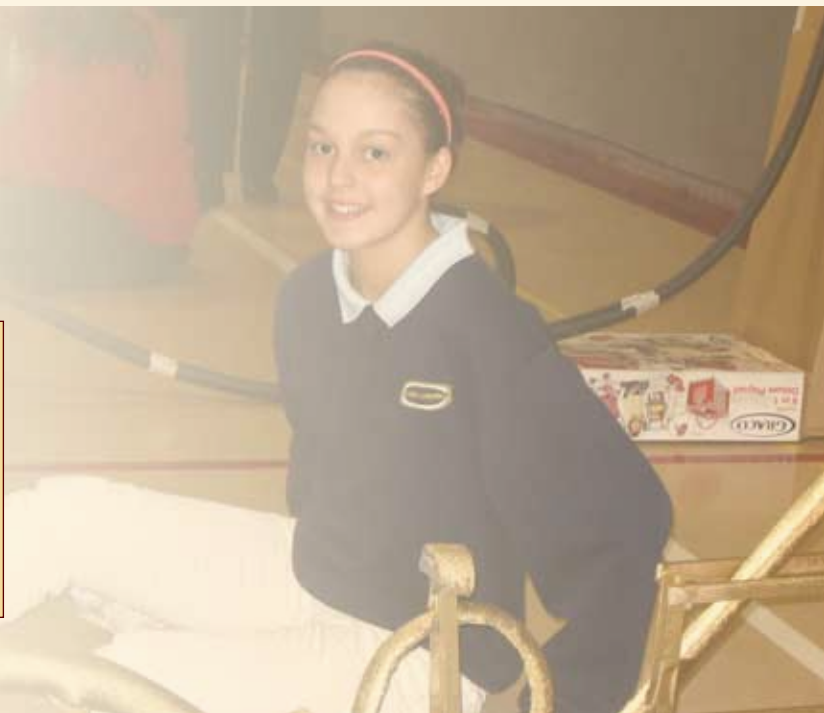
1. Our goal to increase the percentage of current sixth graders scoring at the proficient level on the ITBS as measured by the Science score as seventh graders. We met this goal. In 2006-2007, 70% of sixth graders were proficient. In 2007-2008, 79.2% of seventh graders were proficient. Our goal predicted we would see an increase in proficiency. A 9.2% increase in proficiency was achieved.
2. During the 2008-09 school year, CVCS will increase the percentage of 2007-2008 fourth graders scoring at the proficient level on the ITBS as measured by the Science score as fifth graders.

ICAM - 8th grade - Reading

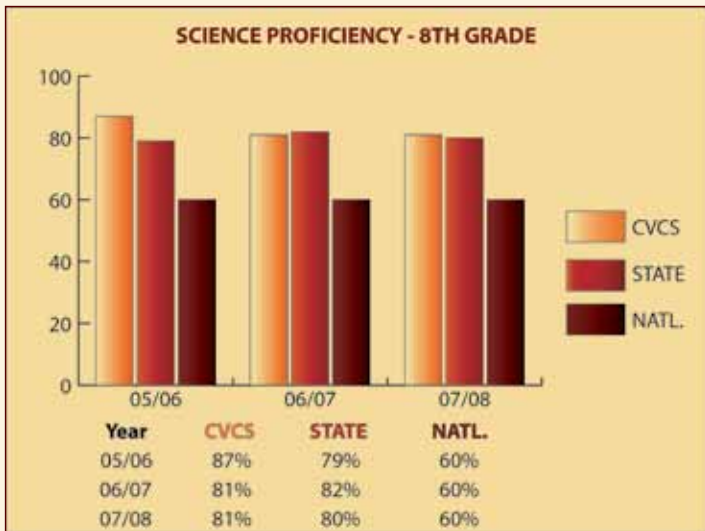
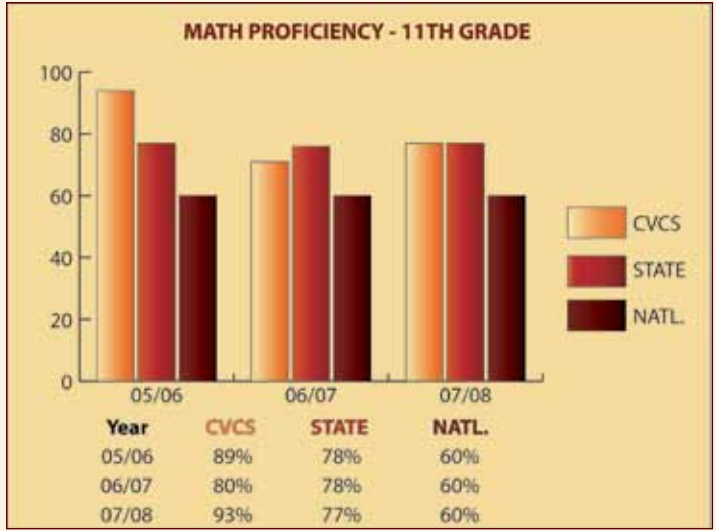
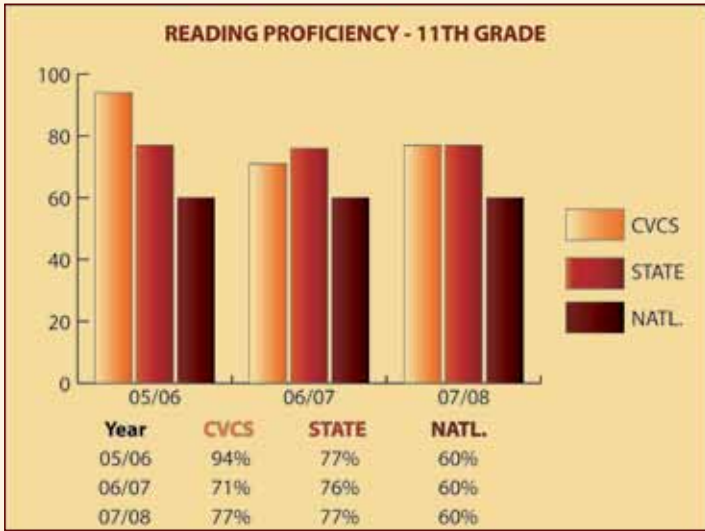

READING GOALS

- Our goal was to increase the percentage of present tenth graders performing at the proficient achievement level as measured by the ITED Reading Comprehension score as eleventh graders. The goal was not met. In 2006-2007, 78.6% of the tenth graders were proficient. In 2007-2008, 75.4% of the eleventh graders were proficient. Our goal predicted we would see an increase in proficiency from tenth to eleventh grade, however, there was a decrease in proficiency of 3.2%.
- The action plan to meet this goal includes the following:
 - Continuation of rigorous professional development program that is focused on research-based instructional strategies and district goal areas
 - Continuation of data study with teachers to gain a better understanding of need areas
 - Test preparation, including test taking skills
- During the 2008-09 school year, CVCS will increase the percentage of 2007-2008 eighth graders performing at the proficient achievement level as measured by the ITBS/ITED Reading Comprehension score as ninth graders.

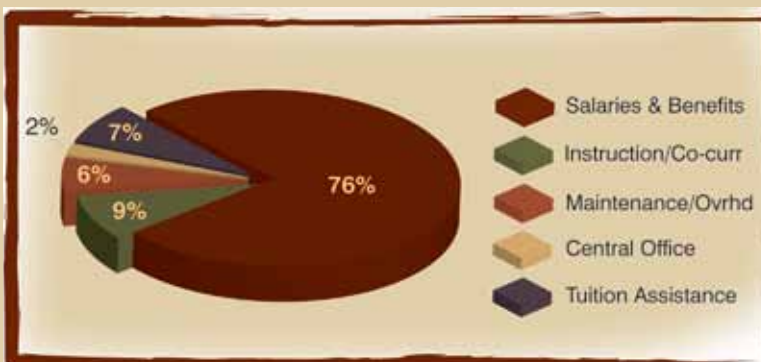

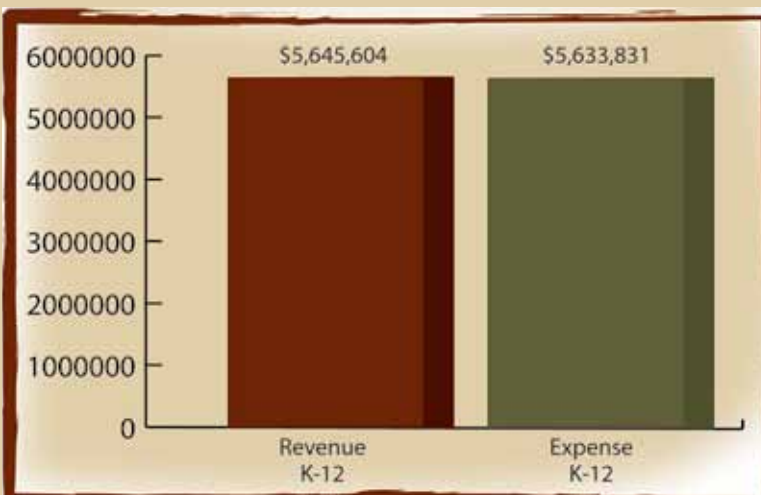

Thanks to their effort and the generosity of many the 2007-08 year ended with a total of \$116,568.

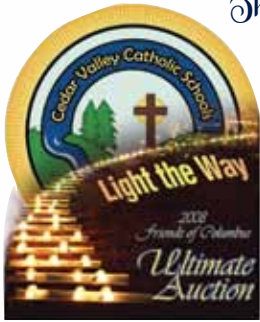
